Frasier is Changing




Left, Karla Rikansrud, our speaker, talked about the changes that will take place in the buildings at Frasier Meadows. Karla also thanked our club for our donations to Frasier. Karla has been in her position as Vice President for Philanthropy and Social Responsibility at Frasier for 9 months. She pointed out the building which will be torn down because of the damaged it sustained in the 2013 flood. Per the building regulations in

Boulder, Frasier is giving 20% of the cost of its new building project to the City of Boulder to help the city build affordable housing. The city will partner with Boulder Housing Partners and Mt. Calvary Church to build the new housing. There will be design festivals in the next weeks to envision the new affordable housing.

Frasier is going to build 98 new apartment units. The Marketing Team has a list of prospects for the new units. Already 75 % of the units have been spoken for with people putting deposits on the units to hold them. There will be efficiency, one-bedroom and two-bedroom apartments. Frasier will also build an expanded Wellness Center and an Arts and Education Center. Frasier is currently waiting for city approval on the projects. There will be a new auditorium that is capable of seating 300 people. The room where our club meets will probably be remodeled into apartments. Our club will meet in a new space. The project will cost \$ 90 million. The new apartments are expected to be completed in the spring 2019. Kara said that Frasier was originally build to house retired Methodist ministers. She said a flood wall be erected. There will be a mechanism that will protect cars from flood waters.


Special points of interest:




