
## Leslie Glustrom Presents Municipalization



Left, Leslie Glustrom presented the case for the municipalization of electricity in the City of Boulder. Leslie said we should vote as though our grandchildren mattered. She said the biggest source of greenhouse gas is electricity. We should

care about climate change. We should have less carbon-based fuel. Colorado is coal dependent. Xcel has added renewable energy, but still depends on natural gas and coal. Measure 2L on the City of Boulder ballot will continue the utility tax. Leslie says we should vote "yes" on the three measures 2L, 2O and 2P on the city ballot. Leslie said there are news stories in the Daily Camera that give incorrect information about the municipalization issue. She says we have lost balanced reporting. Leslie says Xcel gets \$ 20 million profit every year from City of Boulder residents.

Kirsten said the leaves in her yard all moved to her neighbor's.




Barbara said she had a lot of leaves in her enclosed patio. Mike, Barbara's son, was visiting, but left to drive back to his home in Las Vegas.
