

Report on Key Club in the Rocky Mountain District August, 2015

1) Since the beginning of the Kiwanis Administrative year, October 1 2014, three new Key Clubs have been chartered in the Rocky Mountain District.

Lander Valley HS (Div. 10) 11/13/2014
Eagles Key Club (a Community Based Key Club (Div. 4) 1/2/2015
Harrison HS (Div. 4) 2/23/15

Currently, I am aware of a Key Club that is in the charter process:

Estes Park HS (Div.16) I believe I was told that paperwork for this school was sent in, but Kiwanis International has no record of it.

2) To the best of my knowledge, the following schools have not paid dues for the 2014-15 school year and were considered **suspended** on February 1, 2015. This list is current as of July 22, 2015. These clubs will go on in-active status on October 1, 2015 if dues are not paid.

Central (Grand Junction) HS (Div. 7) Kelly Walsh HS (Div. 1)
Natrona County HS (Div. 1) South (Denver) HS (Div. 15)

Currently we have 93 schools with active charters, 4 suspended clubs, 7 Inactive chartered clubs, and 2964 paid members.

3) Charters for the following schools are on in-active status due to non-payment of dues in the 2013-14, and 2014-15 school years:

Broomfield HS
Cheyenne Central HS
Del Norte HS
Dubois HS
Pueblo County HS (2 charters)
Saratoga HS

In order to return a charter to active status, Kiwanis clubs would need to send in a \$100 reactivation fee and the current year's dues for Key Club members at that school. It is my understanding that the charters at these schools will be revoked on or shortly after October 1, 2015.

4) The 2015 RMD Key Club District Convention was held at the Sheraton Denver West Hotel, April 8-10, 2015. We had 255 registered attendees. Zackery Larsen, Glenwood Springs HS, was elected as our 2015-16 District Governor.

5) This year's Key Club International Convention was held in Indianapolis, IN June 23-28, 2015. Asst. Administrator Barb Fuller did a wonderful job to put together a convention air package. Tour dates were June 23-June 30, 2015. We will flew into Indianapolis, IN; bussed to Chicago after the convention was over; toured there, and then flew home from Chicago Midway. Cost of the tour was \$1290/ student, quad occupancy. We had 22 students and 4 adults on the tour.
