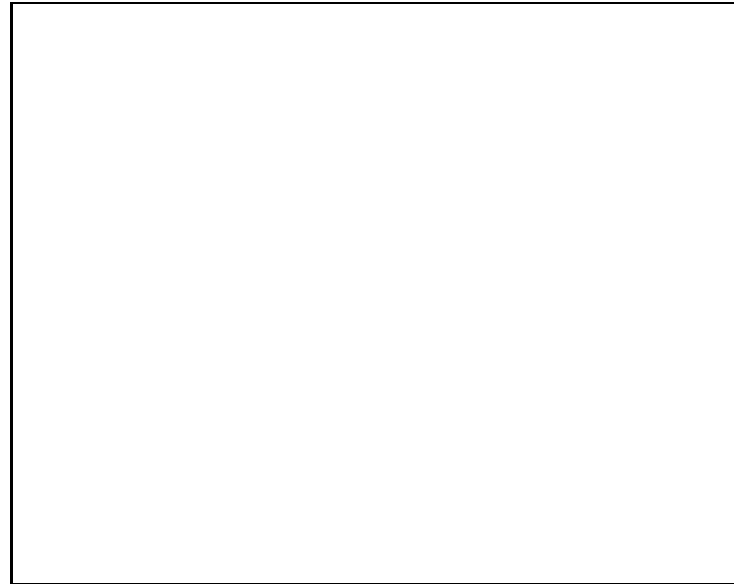
Member Concerns

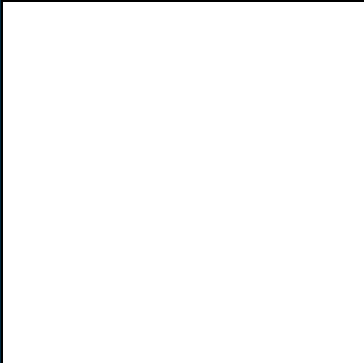


Jim Taylor announced the **winners** in the Loser and Loser Loser pools. Half the proceeds (\$405) go to our foundation. Congratulations!

Community Growth Issues

Cathy Green

Our speaker was Cathy Green, Town Administrator for Palmer Lake, Colorado. She is responsible for administering the management of Palmer Lake, which includes such things as tax issues, growth planning, saving Palmer Lake, and organizing city administration activities and policies.

Cathy has an extensive experience base and educational background in political science, administration and city planning. Before her current job, she was Town Manager

of Monument, City of Pueblo Director of Planning and Development and Assistant City Manager; and many other jobs in city management and planning.

Cathy spoke about the issues of planning for community growth, an issue at the heart of the Tri-Lakes area. Her presentation was titled, "Who are all these people and where did they come from?" It is something most MHKC members wonder frequently.

Cathy outlined the differences between 50 years ago, when there was a fairly clear distinction between rural life and city life and how development of each was fairly clear and distinctive. Now, there is a vast, confusing, unclear mixture.

Jackson Creek is a good example: Large areas of housing, which are mixed between apartment buildings, many small-lot-home complexes, and some rural areas, with the commercial areas growing willy-nilly along a commercial strip, which is inconvenient to any of the housing.

Some of the reasons for this hodgepodge are that planners:

- Put cars first over walking;
- Let water needs drive where development is;
- Feed the great American Dream that every house needs a yard.

Out of that came: congestion, isolation of families from schools and commercial areas, health issues, and costlier lifestyles.

Cathy concluded that development planners need to change their concepts to include:

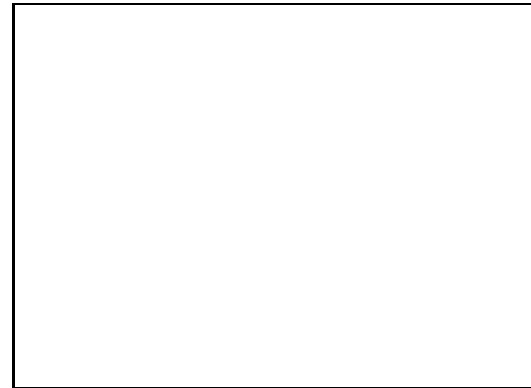
- Walkable commercial areas and downtowns
- Safe walks to schools nearby
- Facing the issues of water and how it impacts development
- Mixed use of rural land vs developed
- Improved use of housing areas to improve living conditions; i.e. add more parks, sidewalks, etc.

- Increased planning for individual transportation
- Protected "third spaces," those places people go when not at work or home... Hang out places.

As Cathy said in closing, "The problem is misunderstanding and miscommunication." Her presentation was an excellent way to solve some of the problems, as we are now smarter about how our communities should be planned.
