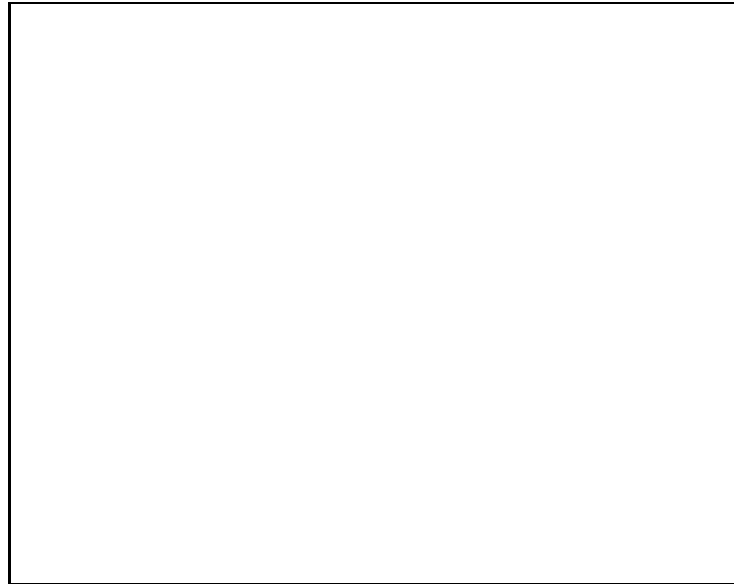
Member Concerns

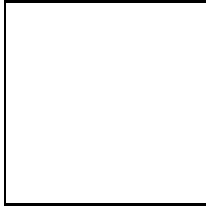
Pat Losey was happy that Jerry Losey had a birthday! Us too!

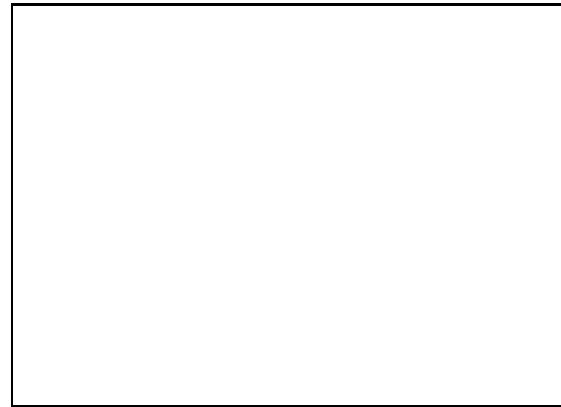

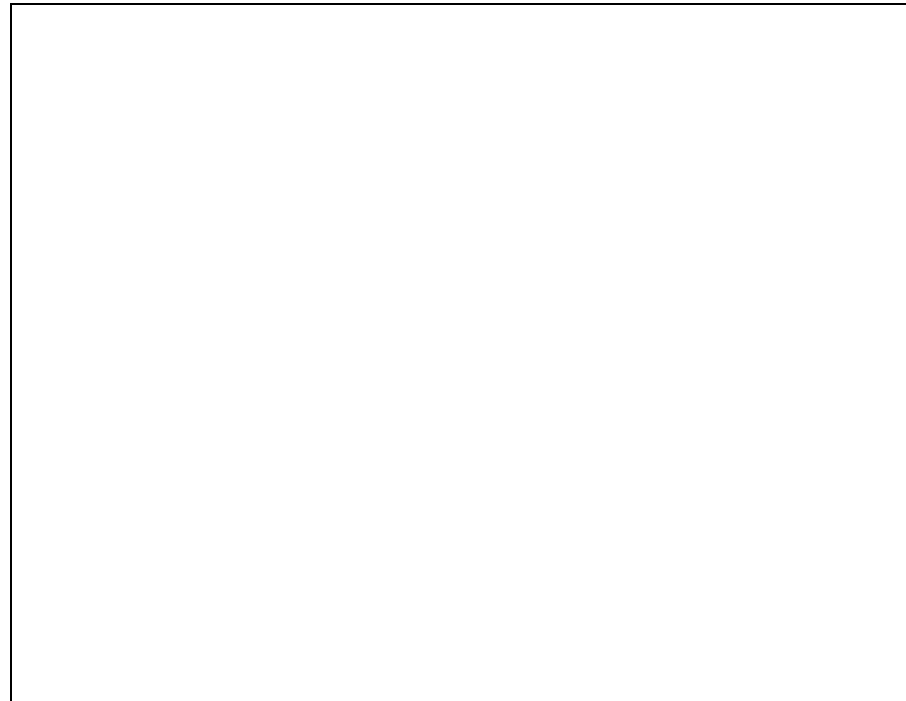

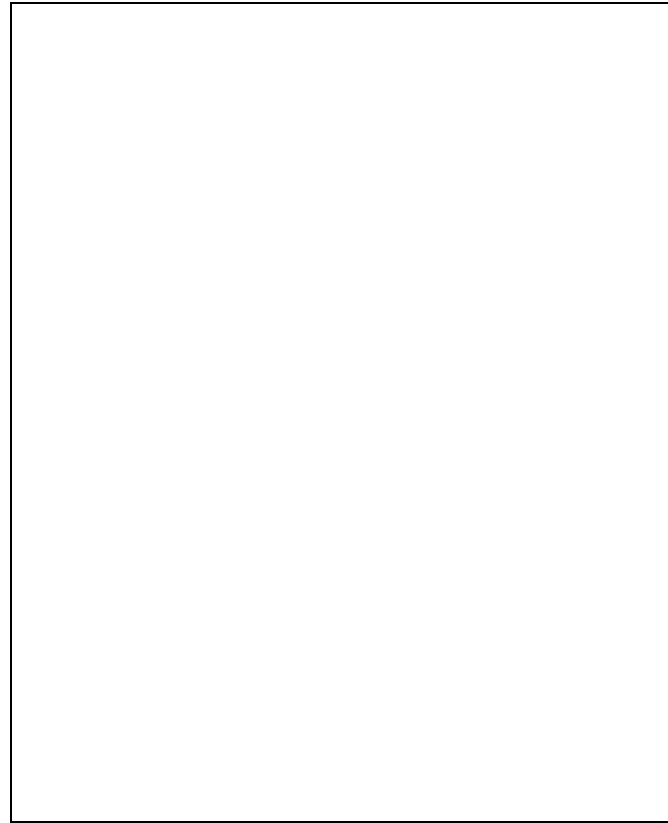

Why would you willingly jump out of a perfectly good airplane?



C1C Connor Livingston, told Jay Kelley that his first freefall was when he was dropped on his head when he was a baby! Some things will shape your life early on!

Introducing the parachute team, our member Jay Kelley mentioned the Icarus story about getting too close to the sun and melting your wings. In fact, the canopy now used by the team is a zero velocity, nine-cell electrical canopy made by the Icarus Corporation in New Zealand. It is even turbo-charged!

LtCol Baerman introduced the team members, and showed a video of their Thanksgiving training trip highlighting many team exploits. Great, but it just made me dizzy. The mission of the 98 Flight Training Squadron is to provide parachute training to Cadets. The Air Force Parachute Team now is part of the Air Education and Training Command (AETC) and conducts training of their advanced parachute teams, mostly

during the holiday seasons. Command goals are to inspire the next generation of Lieutenants. They have 3 UV-18B, Twin Otters based at Peterson AFB.

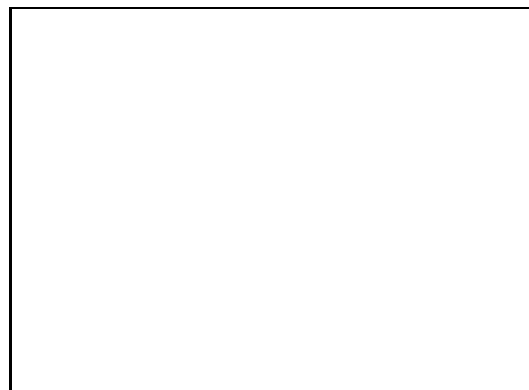
C1C Connor Livingston and MSgt Pickering told us about Airmanship 490 (AM-490) which is the basic free fall course instructed by Cadet members of the "Wings of Blue." They train 700+ students a year through a 5 jump program. Your first jump is solo, freefall, with a 10 second delay. Cadets can progress through advanced training to Green and Blue status. Students enrolled in the course undergo more than 30 hours of ground training prior to their first free fall jump. The rigorous ground training introduces and develops procedures and techniques for high altitude free fall, and for operating a steerable parachute system. The course focuses on safety and emergency procedures to aid the students' ability to overcome their fears and perform under the extremely stressful and potentially life-threatening situations they may encounter.

C1C Brandon Bylina told us that before the Fall semester begins, Cadets entering their sophomore year at the Academy are hand-selected for an upgrade program, AM-491, into the "Wings of Blue," known informally as the "Wings of Green".

C1C Kevin Min gave us information about AM-496, that is composed of the junior and senior "Wings of Blue" members. This group is divided into the junior competition/demonstration team, and the senior competition/demonstration team. While cadets in AM-496 dedicate themselves to the demands of their individual teams, they remain united in their performance of duties within the squadron, team dynamics, and stay steadfast to their core mission as Airmanship 490 instructors and jumpmasters.
