As a 501.c.3 non-profit corporation, the Monument Hill Foundation is the granting arm of Monument Hill Kiwanis Club. It's mission is supporting the Community with particular focus on the Tri-Lakes Area of Northern El Paso County, Colorado. Historically, its roots go back to the Monument Hill Sertoma club. When the International Sertoma membership dwindled in 2004 the club moved from Sertoma and joined Kiwanis International. At that time the club withdrew \$56,000 from Sertoma and created the Monument Hill Fund. There was little activity from 2004 through 2010 until the Fund was converted to the Foundation with a Mission Statement.

Today the Monument Hill Foundation is funded by Bingo sales (the largest contributor), Empty Bowls, Peach Sales, the Craft Fair, King Soopers and Safeway Gift Cards,

Football and Basketball pools, Amazon Smile, Superbowl Boards, Bed Pan Donations, Memorials for Deceased Members, Individual Donations, Insurance Policies, Estates and Wills and Corporate donations.

Ted Bauman summarized the impact of the Foundation to the community. Since 2010, the Foundation has distributed \$275,000.00 of Discretionary Sponsorship Funds to youth and community. Some examples include:

- D38 students: 20 Career Starter Scholarships, equipment for 15 Deaf and Blind students, 200 special education students served by Therapeutic Riding, Swimming, and Gymnastics programs, 100 Bearbotics students
- 108 students from Lewis-Palmer High School and Palmer Ridge High School attended the Rocky Mountain Youth Leadership Conferences
- 16 Tri-Lakes Area students in the Court Appointed Special Advocates Program (CASA)
- 200 families supported in the Tri-Lakes Area/Northern El Paso County in the Resource Exchange Programs
- 360 Students in the Children's Literacy Programs at the Monument Library
- 20 Tri-Lakes Area students served through the Griffith Center
