Bethesda Gardens Monument

Our guest speaker today was Shirley Colvard, Director of Sales and Marketing for the soon-to-open Bethesda Gardens assisted living and memory care facility in Monument. She was accompanied by Angela Green, VP for sales for Bethesda Senior Living Communities.

Bethesda has been in operation for more than 60 years and has two other facilities in the Colorado Springs area. With more than 18 communities throughout the West and Midwest, they are a non-profit, faith-based organization with headquarters in Colorado Springs.

Shirley outlined the various levels of care for seniors, from independent living through memory care. The Gardens will provide both assisted living and memory care in 60 units. Apartments range from studio to 2 bedroom, with a separate secure area for the 13 memory care residents. Prices begin at \$3395 per month for a studio. An initial "move in fee" of \$3000 is required from all and is nonrefundable. Additional care requirements may range from \$300 to \$2000 per month. Anticipated cost of living increases of 3% to 5% can be expected.

Amenities include all meals, transportation, cable TV, phone and wireless internet, housekeeping and laundry, medication management, onsite therapy and a full range of lifestyle programs. Apartments are unfurnished but include carpet, blinds and a small refrigerator.
