NEPCO Transportation and Land Use Update

Our speaker was Colonel Tom Vierzba, USAF (Ret.), Chairman of the El Paso County Highway Advisory Commission, and Chairman of the NEPCO [Northern El Paso County Coalition of Community Associations] Transportation and Land Use committee.

Tom Vierzba is a career USAF officer with a background in program management. He also was a Weapons System Officer in F-4Ds and F16s. He retired in 2003.

Tom is deeply involved in Transportation and Land Use planning in our part of the county, and his presentation was an update on the future of these areas.

His first subject was a look at the transportation projects listed here, with a short summary of future actions:

- Highway 105: Widened to 4 lanes from I-25 to Hiway 83.
- Monument Hill Road: Many safety and intersection changes.
- Beacon Lite Road: Safety changes and paving.
- Jackson Creek Parkway: Widened to 4 lanes and changes to accommodate an increase in traffic from 6,000 cars to 31,000 by 2020.
- Higby Road/Gleneagle Drive/Furrow Road: Safety changes, and connecting Gleneagle Drive to Higby.
- Struthers/Gleneagle Intersection: Change to a round-about.
- I-25: Change local tax funding to support widening I-25 to 6 lanes to Castle Rock.
- Powers Avenue: First work will be an overpass at Research Blvd, followed by a connection between Voyager Blvd and a large interchange added at I-25.
- High Speed Railroad: Built by 2040, to connect Colorado Springs to DIA. The trip will be 30 minutes and cost about \$30.

Next, Tom reviewed upcoming Land Development in Northern El Paso County.

Residential:

- Sanctuary Pointe - 601 homes
- Forest Lake - 270 homes plus an additional 167 expansion
- Jackson Ranch - 42 homes
- Revised Home Place Ranch - 200-400 homes
- Potential for another 100 - 150 homes in Woodmoor
- Flying Horse North - 283 homes
- Wagons West Twin Homes and Townhouses - 151 homes

Commercial:

- Wolf Business Park on Beacon Lite Road
- Pilot Travel Center at Baptist and I-25
- Auto body repair facility on Beacon lite Road
- KFC on Jackson Creek Parkway
- Potential for development behind Home Depot/Kohls
- Two Senior living Centers ~ 300 beds - Phase 2 in the planning stage.

In summary, Tom said there were going to be 2400 new homes in NEPCO's area by 2020, with a concomitant number of businesses. The growth is expected to continue into the foreseeable future. This was a well-done presentation by a man who had a good grip on his subject. Very
