## Youth Protection Program

Our guest speaker was our own Max Williams. Max let us know that the training he provided is required for all 300,000 member of Kiwanis International (KI) to reduce child abuse in any Kiwanis project. Especially since the purpose of Kiwanis is to serve the children of the world. Kiwanians should act with the HIGHEST STANDARDS. Youth Protection guidelines were first approved by KI in 2007.

Things to lookout for when dealing with kids include emotional abuse, physical abuse, sexual abuse and "troubling behavior" in the kids we serve. If these are seen, the authorities must be notified. This is our required KI Annual training session. If the Kiwanian is the authority, then contact the local Police or sheriff or the National Child Abuse Hotline at 1-800-422-4453. Kiwanians who are not licensed professionals must report the child either to school district, local PD or to the abuse hotline. Do not attempt to solve the issue yourself, get the child to the professionals.

If Kiwanis event is held off school grounds and overnight, there must be Chaperones of both sexes at a rate of one adult per ten youth of the same sex.

For all Kiwanis events involving children, all Kiwanians must have KI approved background checks. The KI background checks will cost \$25 to the individual; see either Max Williams or Mike Luginbuhl. For those in the Service Leadership Program you must also get a District 38 background check, which is more expensive. Many clubs international require all their members to have the KI background check.

When transporting youth, the best practice is the "rule of three"-at least three people in the car at all times, along with documented approval from a parent or guardian for the transportation

arrangements. In the case of medication, even an aspirin, you must have written permission from the parents. Kiwanis does not allow any use of alcohol, tobacco or marijuana at any youth event.

KI requires any personal information on the children must be keep in a confidential record for at least three years and then shred any paper copies of the data.

Don't initiate online connections with youth - begin an online "friendship" with a youth only at the youth's request. If a youth requests online friendship (e.g., Facebook), use your best judgment when responding.

Remember Use the Highest Standards.
