When Committing a Crime, Have A Friend
Take Your Cellphone to Miami

At our 6 January meeting, our scheduled speaker was unable to attend, so member Mark Pfoff, now a computer expert for defense lawyers, provided us with some basic information on what we all agreed to when we acknowledged our cellphone terms and conditions. If you are considering a criminal act, then the title is his recommendation on what to do with your cellphone. His reason for the statement is presented below.

Your cellphone in its terms and conditions allows the cellphone providers to obtain location information concerning your cell phone and retain it. According to their publications, it is retained for 90 days. If you happen to tell the law enforcement no one else uses your phone, you have admitted the location information obtained for the cell phone also provides possible locations for yourself.

NELOS - Network Event Location System (AT&T) provides detailed location information for your cellphone. If you are pinging on three cell towers that location could be accurate within 25 meters. If you are driving and the cellphone pings multiple cell towers your path can be tracked. Even if you not using your cellphone.

A-GPS - Assisted GPS provides a very accurate location; potentially more accurate than NELOS data,. It could put you at the scene of the crime. Most cellphones now has A-GPS.

RTT - (Verizon) Range To Tower provides from a computer algorithm the distance of the cell phone from a specific cell towers. This only provides the distance from the tower, not a location.

PCMD - (Sprint) Per Call Management Data provides the distance of the cell phone from the tower. Similar to RTT.

Bottom line, your cellphone is disclosing your location at all times it is on. Hence Mark's advice if you plan on committing a crime. For the rest of us who aren't considering criminal, just recognize all this data is available.
