Jim Hatley and Jim Murphy

Our speakers were the Jims, fellow MHKC members.

Jim Hatley



Jim Hatley, one of our newer members, was first, and using a nice powerpoint with lots of pictures, gave us a good overview of his life, which started in California.

Growing up consisted of Fishing, Boy Scouts, Outdoors, Sports, Fishing [Jim listed it twice, that was not my mistake], and Volunteering. His family then moved to Colorado Springs.

Jim attended Sierra High School where he majored in Cross-country running and wrestling [my assumption since that is all he mentioned about his High School experience].

Jim then joined the Navy and became a damage-control specialist, or fireman, on Guam. He enjoyed the work, the responsibility that he was given at a low rank, and scuba diving. Never made it to a ship.



After his service, he got a Business degree from the University of Phoenix and then got in the Garage Door business, which his dad had also been in. After 13 years, Jim opened his own Garage Door company in Monument.



Along the way, Jill came into his life, and after marriage came 7 children, three of theirs and four through adoption as part of the foster parent program, where Jim and Jill have been active as foster parents and as trainers. That and all those young children keep them very busy.



Jim noted he still likes to hunt and fish but the frequency is less as there are many other things competing for his time. He said he gets lots of supervision...

All in all, a very nice look into the interesting life of one of our newer members, one who is still working and raising a family.

Jim Murphy



Jim Murphy, a MHKC member since 2008, is one of our more visible members, participating in a number of our activities. So it was good to get to know a bit more about him too.



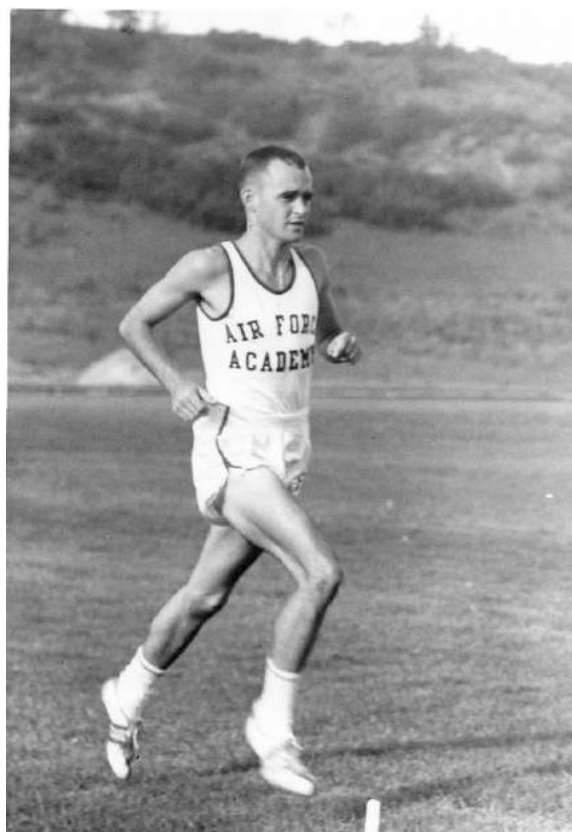
Born in Chicago in a family of 5 boys, he eventually wandered west to the US Air Force Academy, where he was a member of the Class of 1966. He also got a masters degree in International Relations at USC. During that time, he met an AF nurse and he and Patt were married back at the Academy, 48 years ago.





After pilot training, Jim wanted to fly C-141s but ended up in Southeast Asia flying CH-53 helicopters on Special Ops missions. He then transitioned back into heavies, in fact the heaviest—the C-5 Galaxy. He flew that airplane for a number of years, becoming a squadron and group commander.

After four headquarters tours and 28 years of service, Jim retired as a Colonel, and then worked for ARINC, a defence contractor providing world-wide command and control capabilities. He and Patt have a family of military members so have not lost their contact with that way of life



Jim is renowned among those who know as a world-class runner. He was a three-time High School champion, setting records that lasted decades. At the USAFA, he was a NCAA All-American in both track and cross country, became the first ever USAFA Track and Field National Champion, and was a finalist for two Olympic teams. He is in the US Air Force Academy Athletic Hall of Fame and the Colorado Sports Hall of Fame. He is still active in the sport as a Track Official.

Jim's remarks were quite enlightening to those who do not know this Irishman well, and a good reminder for those who do of what an interesting and fulfilling life he has had.
