A Trip to the Middle East with Secretary of Defense Mathis

The Office of the Secretary of Defense asked if the Gazette would send a reporter to accompany SecDef Mathis to Middle East. Tom Roeder was experiencing back trouble at the time, so Editor Vince Bzdek managed to throw himself into the assignment. Our wonderful SecDef, who prefers the title of Warrior Monk, over Maddog Mathis, apparently finds folks from Western Military towns above the reporters of Beltway News outlets. Mathis is more of

"This is My Duty" type than any other cause for him taking the missions he does. Something well understood by MHK members.

Sec. Mathis was very well received by the ruling members of the Middle Eastern countries, as he has known them for many years and they all trust him, because of their personal relationships with the secretary. The secretary had very few big shows with the US troops in the area, because they had their work to do and the secretary met with them in small groups. When dealing with his Marines he stressed:

Be Polite, Be Professional, and Be Prepared to Kill Everyone, if needed.

In Secretary Mathis viewed the US Military is the world's greatest force for peace. At the same time, the greatest threat to piece is the derisiveness of the American Public. The American Armed Forces must be prepared by being feared and respected in all they do.

We then had a most enjoyable question, answer period that was very lively and spirited, and off the record.

I know I went away from the session having much, more confidence in our local newspaper now that is the largest and most respected paper in our great state.
