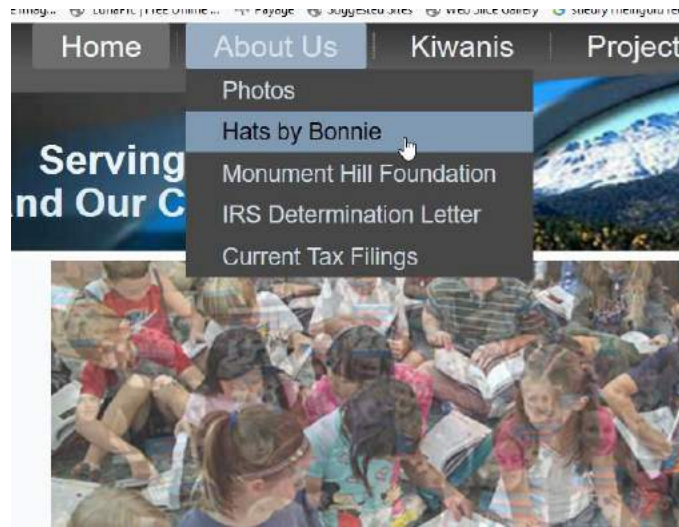

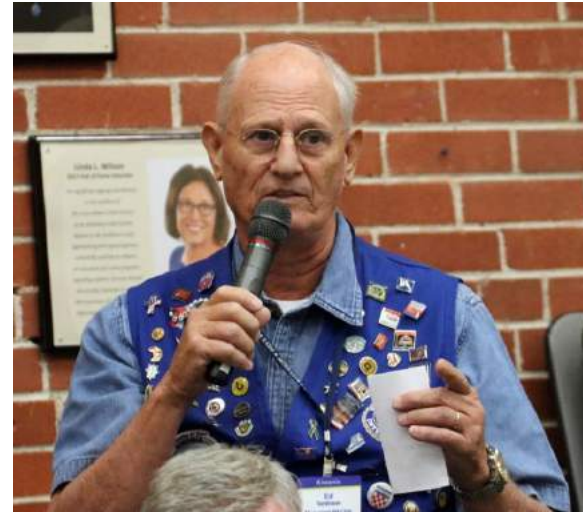

Colorado Springs Airport

This week's speaker was Greg Phillips, Director of Aviation, Colorado Springs Airport. He is a 1979 Graduate of the United States Military Academy at West Point and earned a degree in engineering. While serving in the Army Greg earned his wings as a helicopter pilot and was an Army Ranger. He is also an instrument rated commercial pilot.

Following military service Greg worked as an engineering project manager for Boeing and as a Civil Engineer and Program Manager for the Federal Aviation Administration.

While at the FAA he served as Deputy Program Manager during the design and construction of Denver International Airport.

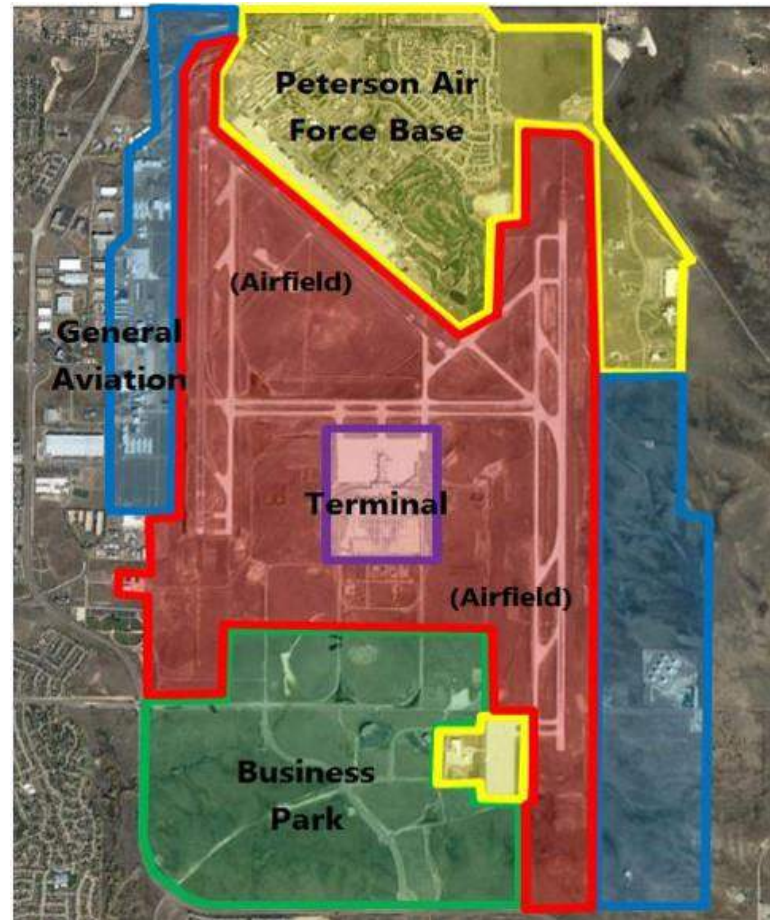
Greg served in executive positions at five airports before assuming his current role in Colorado Springs. He currently serves as President of the Northwest Chapter Board of Directors for the American Association of Airport Executives and is a member of both the Colorado Springs Convention & Visitors Bureau Board and the Colorado Springs Economic Development Council.

He is an Accredited Airport Executive, a Senior Fellow in the Council for Excellence in Government, and an active member of the Colorado Airport Operators' Association. Outside of work, he is an avid cyclist and a long time alpine ski race coach.



Greg gave us a wide ranging view of the COS Airport and how the airport serves the community. He broke it down into four general categories: Commercial Air Service (FedEx and Key Lime), Corporate and General Aviation, Peterson AFB (who provide excellent fire protection as a tenant), and economic benefits derived from their Business Park (including their excellent World War II Museum). The economic benefits include 27,000 jobs generating 1.75 billion in payroll. He pointed out that the 7,200 acres of airport property give us opportunities that other smaller airports do not have. Several projects that will expand opportunities include the National Museum of WWII,

Western LLC 60,000 sq ft hangar, FEDEX office and maintenance building, Peterson AFB expansion, and Peak Innovations Business Park.



The COS Airport guiding principles are: 1) Lower operating costs, 2) Diversify revenue, 3) Emphasize Air Service, 4) Commit to Marketing. Thanks to efficient management, the airport has shown steady growth by preparing for the shift in aviation to larger, more efficient planes, a shift driven by fuel costs and the present shortage of qualified pilots. They have also improved customer service by licensing Lyft and Uber to work at the airport. They have an excellent 'no deficiency' TSA rating with perfect performance for the last two years.



Greg also discussed the fire that occurred the night of April 16. In addition to fire and smoke damage, it caused extensive flooding damage.

They have proven that they are a vibrant and critical part of the Colorado Springs community and we thank Greg and his staff for their efforts.
