Jim's BONUS

May 21st is the 141st day of the year and...

141 is the second n to give a prime Cullen number (of the form $n^{2n} + 1$). Cullen numbers were first studied by Fr. James Cullen in 1905. The first few Cullen numbers are 3, 9, 25, 65, 161, 385, ... The first few prime Cullen numbers are numbers 3, 393050634124102232869567034555427371542904833,... corresponding to $n = 1, 141, 4713, 5795, 6611, 18496, 32292, 32469, 59656, 90825$. As of February 2016, the largest known Cullen prime is $6679881 \times 26679881 + 1$. It is a megaprime with 2,010,852 digits.

May 25th, the 145th day of the year...

$145 = 1! + 4! + 5!$. A factorion is an integer which is equal to the sum of factorials of its digits. There are exactly four such numbers. 1, 2 and 145 are three of them, what's the fourth?

Such numbers are called factorions, a term created by Cliff Pickover in 1995.

Painting Demonstration

Oil Painter for 30 years, doing fulltime since 1998 when he moved here.

Teaches at Senior Center in Colorado Springs; was in the Navy for 21 years.

When he was approaching retirement, was looking for things to do. Painting has filled his day and has become a second career. John believes that any talent is a gift from God and is meant to be shared.

Saturday's painting activity was based upon the cover of a book on Scotland. John pre-sketched the background to make it easier for our "volunteers".

4 stages to painting -

1 - Paint shapes,

2 - Then in each shape, define the colors within - the values - lightness and darkness

3 - Define even more,

4 - Finishing touches

We had four volunteers, each given five minutes to complete their assignment under direction from John.



Painter #1 - Jim Hatley - Stage 1

Painting water first, then sky using same brush with different blue.



Painter #2 Pat Loesy - Stage 1

She used green to paint mountains

Don't paint like you are painting a wall - focus on applying the paint, then manipulate it.



Painter #3 - Bryan McMeekin - Stage 1-2

Finish trees and back mountain, yellow foreground fields.



Painter #4 - Barrie Town - Stage 3

Paint the darks and shadows



Painter # 5 - John - finishing up - Stage 4

Using palette knives as it is easier to layer, colors don't blend as much as when using a brush.



The Drawing - A work of art!

Q&A -

Q - How long will it take an oil painting to dry?

Oil drying - should be dry "enough" in 3 days, depends on how thick it is.

Q - how long does it take John to complete a painting?

Old Masters, would paint, then manipulate repeatedly over days and months. When painting outdoors, very quickly, "Plen Aire" - the painter only has 30-60 minutes before the light changes too much.

Entertaining and very educational. Thanks John!
