Jim's BONUS

The 154th day of the year; 154 is the smallest number which is a palindrome in base 6, base 8, and base 9. Can you determine these numbers?

The 155th day of the year; 155 is the sum of the primes between its smallest and largest prime factor.  $155 = 5 \times 31$  and  $(5 + 7 + 11 + 13 + 17 + 19 + 23 + 29 + 31 = 155)$ . Also,  $155^2 + 155 \pm 1$  are twin primes. You may be surprised how frequently  $x^2 + x \pm 1$  forms twin primes.

The 158th day of the year; 158 is the smallest number such that sum of the number plus its reverse is a non-palindromic prime:  $158 + 851 = 1009$  and 1009 is a non-palindromic prime. Also, 158 is the sum of the first nine Mersenne prime exponents. (a Mersenne prime is a prime number that is one less than a power of two)

The 159th day of the year; 159 is the sum of 3 consecutive prime numbers:  $47 + 53 + 59$ . Also, 159 can be written as the difference of two squares in two ways.

## Race and Religion

Paul Harvey was born and raised in Oklahoma, attended college there and later received his PhD from the University of California, Berkeley. He has taught at Colorado College and Valparaiso University in Indiana, and since 1996 has been professor of American history at UCCS. He is the author/editor of eleven books and numerous articles on various aspects of religion in American history, and is currently writing a biography of the important twentieth-century black theologian Howard Thurman and his influence on the civil rights movement.

Howard Thurman was probably the most influential theologian and preacher impacting Martin Luther King, Jr. Unlike King, Thurman was a very private person and not into activism at all. He brought to King the ideas of non-violence. He remained cloistered throughout most of his life but was instrumental in the liberation theology



movement that moved King so much. Thurman was born in Dayton Ohio in 1899. He attended Morehouse College in Atlanta and attended seminary in Rochester NY, only one of three blacks. He moved to Howard University in 1933 and in 1935 traveled to India and taught at the University of Sri Lanka. While there for a short time he met with Mahatma Gandhi, studied nonviolence with him, and became an advocate of a more metaphysical, mystical type of christianity emphasizing a spiritual Jesus over the institutional church. He spread a sort of Gandhian Gospel. He started an interracial congregation at a church in San Francisco from 1944 to 1953 and was always moved by the oppressed and had a missionary appeal that emphasized music. He stressed the spiritual and mystical, even dreaming. Afterward he returned to teach at Howard University where he directly influenced King. He told King in short to prepare for his activist role by privately meditating, dreaming, and spiritually readying himself which he evidently did with some success.

Many of Howard's pupils went on to success in activist roles that greatly changed the black and mixed racial religious experience in America. He mentored activists though he was never an activist himself and for this he was heavily criticized. He was a universalist and pluralistic theologian who emphasized the individual over society. He believed in the 'Botherhood of Man" and became known as "America's Pastor." Dr. Harvey believes that the arc of history is bending his way. I think many of us will want to buy his biography of Thurman when it is published. Thanks for this insightful presentation!
