Jim's BONUS

The 161st day of the year; Every number greater than 161 is the sum of distinct primes of the form  $6n - 1$ . When 161 is rotated 180 degrees it gives a palindromic prime, (191). 161 is the sum of five consecutive prime numbers:  $23 + 29 + 31 + 37 + 41 = 161$ .

The 163rd day of the year;  $(e(\pi \cdot \sqrt{163}))$  is an integer. Ok, not quite! Actually, it is approximately 262537412640768743.99999999999992.

The 164th day of the year; With the ordered digits of 164 we can form 3 2-digits numbers. Those 3 numbers  $\pm 3$  are all prime ( $16 + 3 = 19$ ,  $16 - 3 = 13$ ,  $14 + 3 = 17$ ,  $14 - 3 = 11$ ,  $64 + 3 = 67$ ,  $64 - 3 = 61$ ). Also, in base 10, 164 is the smallest number that can be expressed as a concatenation of two squares in two different ways: as  $1 + 64$  or  $16 + 4$ .

## Vietnam War Commemoration

Saturday's program was a Commemoration of the 50th Anniversary of the Vietnam War. Barrie Town, Jim Taylor and Rich Rima explained what this effort was about. Barrie talked about the Vietnam Era from 1955-1975.



The Commemoration was authorized by Congress, established under the Secretary of Defense and launched by President Obama on May 25, 2012. Although it has taken some time to hold these ceremonies across the nation, over 9000 Partners bring the program to hometown America. The purpose is to thank and honor the 7 million living veterans and families of the 9 million who served in uniform during the Vietnam War, where they live and work.

The eligibility to receive this award were those vets serving on any line of active duty from November 1, 1955 - May 15, 1975.



The recipients received a pin with an eagle showing courage with a blue circle, laurel wreath, and stripes.

- The Eagle-Represents Courage, Honor, and Dedicated Service
- Blue Circle-Matches the blue Canton of the American Flag
- Laurel Wreath-A time-honored symbol representing victory, integrity and strength
- Stripes-Represent the American Flag
- Stars-Represent six allies who fought alongside one another.

Written on the reverse side of the pin were the words "A Grateful Nation Thanks and Honors You". Pins and certificates were presented to club members that served in

the Army, Navy, Air Force, and Marine Corps. There was also a special pin and certificate given to the surviving spouses.



Barrie, Jim, Rich and Watt Hill belong to the Colorado Springs Chapter of the Military Order of the World Wars, and encouraged all who were commissioned officers to join this organization (dedicated to those who served).



The Military Order of the World War was created in 1919 by General of the Armies John "Black Jack" Pershing as a fraternity for American military officers coming out of the Great War. His desire was to have members continue their service in support of their communities and children. Two decades later, when the USA became involved in WWII the organization name was pluralized to its current title of Military Order of the World Wars. They also have members from the Korean War, Vietnam War, Gulf War,

War in Afghanistan, War in Iraq, and peacetime service. Thank you for making this presentation to the club and honoring the service of our members during the Vietnam War.
