MHKC Service Recognition



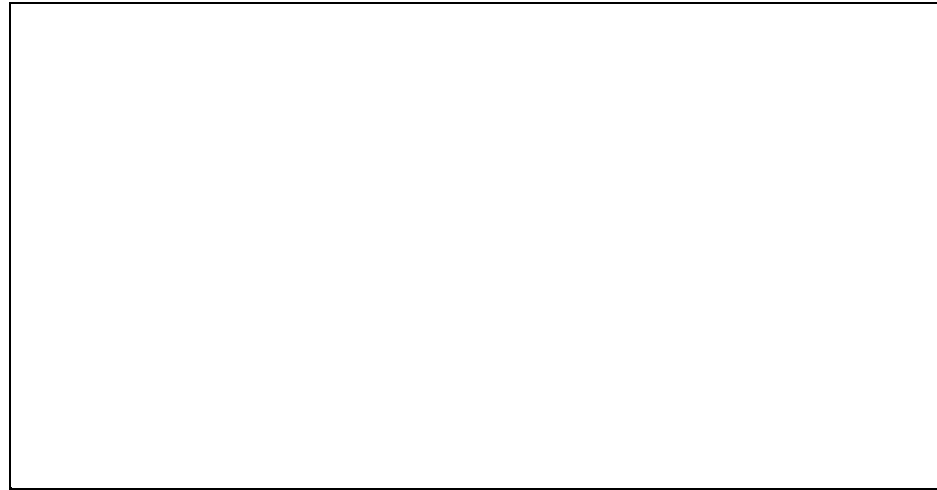

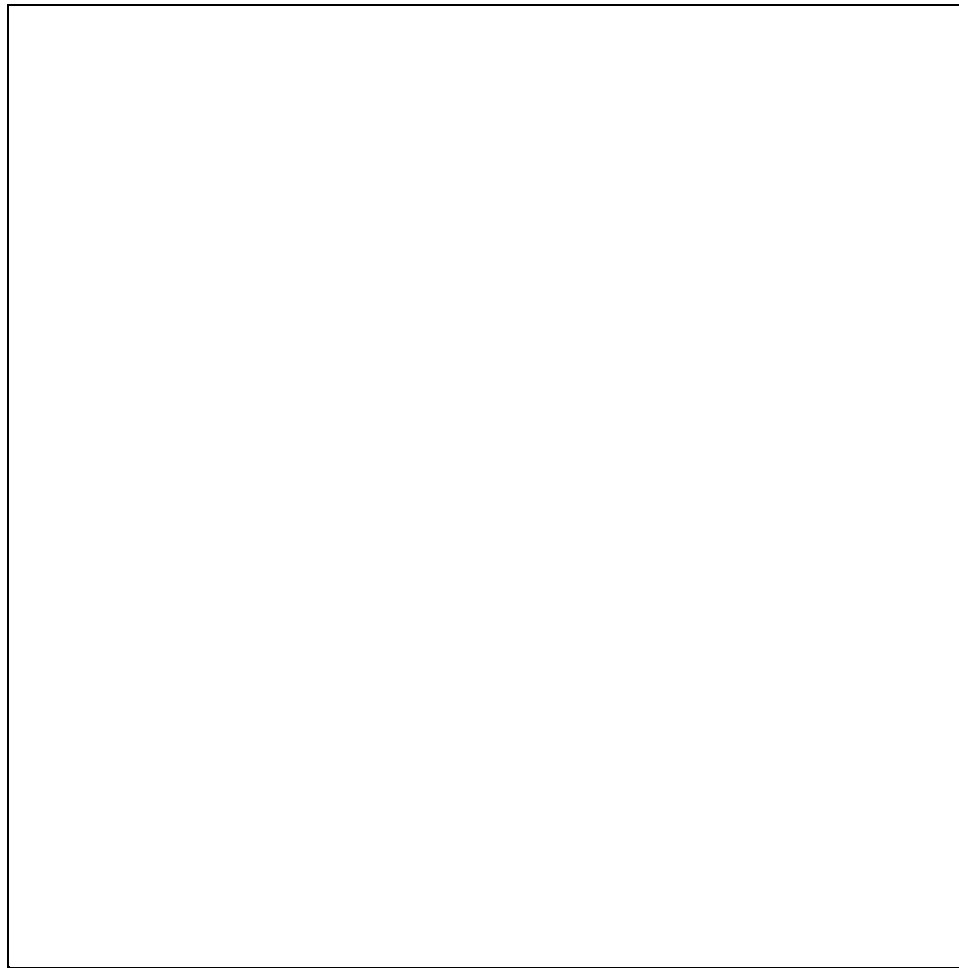
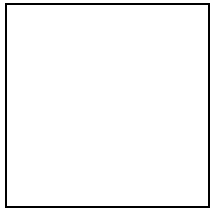
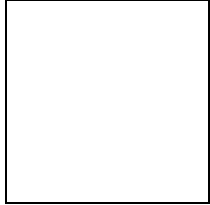
LOSER LOSER POOL

Jim Taylor also gave us details on the Loser Loser Pool. Still at 3 since they all picked the NY Jets.

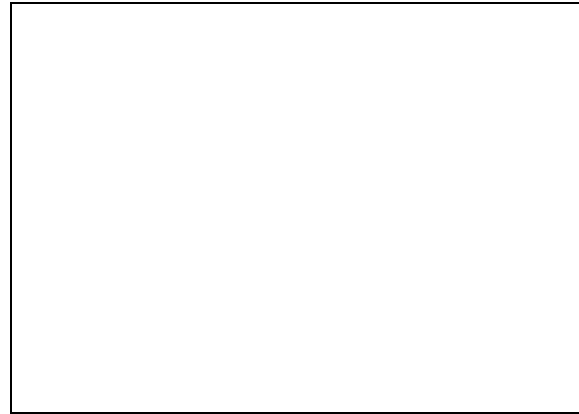
WINNERS POOL

- He attended TWO Thanksgiving parties, just hours apart. Another, having fun!!

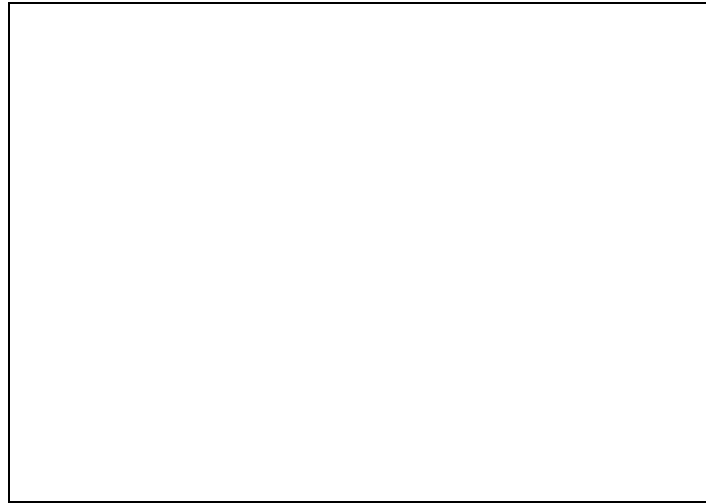
