VITA Opportunities for Volunteering

VITA, Volunteer Income Tax Assistance, needs volunteers. Clients are individuals and families under 60 years of age with \$54,000 or less of income or taxpayers who are age 60 or older. Materials for learning about the tax preparation permitted by VITA is available online by searching for "link and learn" on www.irs.gov. There will also be in person training opportunities in December and January. If you are interested in volunteering for VITA, please see Hugh Price, Charles Locke, or Henry Bauer.

Volunteers are needed for

Greeters, who sign in clients and give them forms to complete. Less testing is required.

Screeners, who help clients arrange their W-2, 1099, 1098 and other forms.

Preparers, who enter the clients' information into the computer program.

Quality Reviewers, who check the preparers' work.

Final Reviewers, who go over the tax returns with the clients on paper for signatures.

There are various sites, times and days of the week although the Senior Center site is open Mondays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays from about 8-noon from February 1 to April 16. Since it is volunteer work, the frequency of work is up to you. The tasks require various levels of testing and computer skills. As noted above, the training materials and tests are provided by the Internal Revenue Service on www.irs.gov. The local VITA effort is sponsored by the Realities Focus charity.
