Cops getting tickets for a change?

Kiwanis Club campaign expresses appreciation for law enforcement

Local law enforcement officers soon will be issued tickets for their actions on the job, thanks to a campaign by the Pueblo Kiwanis Club.

Unlike the tickets given to citizens who break the law, the tickets issued during the Ticket-a-Cop campaign won't serve as a punishment, but a reward, as the tickets will grant access to local events, beginning with summer races at the I-25 Speedway.

"With all the negative (stuff) going on with cops, there just seems to be no respect for anybody, whether its elders or positions of authority, especially with cops," said Kiwanis Club member and former president Bill Yalotz.

"So with all the negativity ... we want to show our appreciation that we're glad they're out there doing their thing."

The brainchild of Kiwanis Club member Gordon Racine, the Ticket-a-Cop campaign began as a way for the club to show its collective appreciation for local law enforcement agencies by giving their officers and employees free tickets to local places and events.

The first of those tickets, race tickets for the I-25 Speedway, already have been donated to the Pueblo County Sheriff's Office and Pueblo Police Department and, over time, Yalotz said the Kiwanis Club's plan is to expand the campaign to all first-responder agencies.

In addition to the race tickets, Yalotz

said the Kiwanis Club eventually will seek to offer additional entertainment opportunities, such as movie tickets, meals at local restaurants, bowling outings and tickets to sporting events at Colorado State University-Pueblo.

"The Kiwanis club's main emphasis is on helping the children, however, we do things to help the community," Yalotz said.

"This is just one more thing ... it's just one more community service that we thought would be a really good idea."
