PROGRAM. Colorado State Representative Pete Lee outlined the Restorative Justice program with the admonition, "it works." The U.S. is an incarceration nation; we lead the world with 25% of our population in prison. In Colorado, 50% of those in prison return. Something is wrong with our system including factors like mandatory sentences and the "war" on drugs. Our crime rate has been going down for the last 15 years. Elected in 2010, Pete advocates for Restorative Justice, an approach to crime which focuses on victims' needs, encourages offenders to take responsibility for their crimes and supports sentences that pay back victims. He introduced a bill in 2011 to define and promote RJ in Colorado state law. Offenders must demonstrate contrition and a willingness to repair harm. The program brings

them together with victims, and with the help of a facilitator, they listen to the impact of their crimes, creating community and a sense of belonging between the parties. "We don't hurt people we know." The parties have to buy into it, and it becomes a dynamic tool, another option to incarceration.
